

74 Responses




79% Cisgender female

Does your library offer any programming aimed specifically at the LGBTQIA community? If so what? If your library does not offer LGBT+ programming, why not?

66 respondents answered this question, 17 said yes their library has or does offer LGBT+ programming

"I suppose the lack of programming about this issue is much like our lack of programming about religion- it's personal, "we don't go there" neutral ground."

"We do not. As far as I know we don't have any LGBT+ staff members, so it's probably because there is no one pushing for it."

I have not offered LGBTQIA programming in our community because of the conservative bend in the community.

"No, my library does not offer any programming toward the LGBTQIA community, as we do not have any who identify as such in our community."

"I don't feel comfortable running a program about a topic I have never experienced or have any clue what they are going through. It would just feel fraudulent."

Cuba Library has a population of 4,500, with an estimated 202 LGBT+ patrons.

Olean NY has around 14,000 people with an estimated 630 LGBT+ patrons.

"No, My question is for you. Why?"

- 42% of LGBT teens say that the community they live in is not accepting of LGBT people
- LGBT youth are twice as likely to be physically assaulted
- 40% of gender expansive youth say they are frequently excluded by their peers
- 51% of LGBT youth are verbally harassed
- 63% of LGBT youth plan on moving out of their town to find acceptance
- LGB youth are almost five times as likely to have attempted suicide compared to heterosexual youth
- 40% of transgender adults reported having made a suicide attempt. 92% of these individuals reported having attempted suicide before the age of 25.



























What is your opinion of libraries offering programs geared specifically at the LGBTQIA community?

Terms and Phrases to Avoid

Homosexual Because of the clinical history of the word "homosexual," it is aggressively used by anti-gay extremists to suggest that gay people are somehow diseased or psychologically/emotionally disordered

Sexual Preference The term "sexual preference" is typically used to suggest that being lesbian, gay or bisexual is a choice and therefore can and should be "cured."

"gay agenda" or "homosexual agenda" Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people are motivated by the same hopes, concerns and desires as other everyday Americans.

Deadnaming when a person comes out or transitions, they often pick a new name that will better represent their new identity. Refusing to use their preferred name is considered hurtful and a form of aggression.

When greeting others

ladies gentlemen ma'am sir girls guys etc.

Consider using instead:

"Thanks, **friends**. Have a great night."

"Good morning, folks!"

"Hi, everyone!"

"And for you?"


"Can I get you **all** something?"





The day before Drag Queen Kids' Party, a local reporter called Stickles to ask about the death threats issued against her — threats that she was unaware of. After hanging up the phone, she stood alone in her office overlooking the parking lot. "The walk between my office to my boss's office is the only time I thought for a split second like maybe I

should reconsider," she said. After talking it over with the library director, Michelle La Voie, Stickles made her decision: "I have to. There's no way I'm calling it off."

After a night of tossing and turning — "I got an hour and a half of sleep. I was so nervous. It had just gotten to be too much," she said — Stickles pulled up to the library, bracing for a scene. What she encountered shocked her.

"Just rainbows everywhere," she recalled. Over 200 supporters flooded the front lawn of the library, many of whom arrived three hours before the event to deter protestors, including a group of drag queens who drove down from Buffalo. They waved pride flags and held signs advocating acceptance and diversity. Protestors, for their part, amounted
